What is phonics?

Using phonics (sounds) to read and spell words.


Initial sounds like s, a, t, p, i, n can be blended to read words.




Phonics Screening Check

- Assess phonics knowledge and reading
- ▶ One week in June 10 minutes
- ► 1:1 test of 40 words
- ▶ 20 real words and 20 pseudo (alien) words
- Results in July
- Opportunity to retake in Year 2

Phonics Terminology

CVC

- It stands for consonant, vowel, consonant.
- These are the first words that your child will read, eg.

cat, mat, sat, hot, tin, pet...

CVCC CCVC CCVCC

sand trim click



Grapheme

A letter or group of letters which represent one single sound (phoneme), eg. a, l, sh, air, ck

At this stage we always use lower case letters. Capitals are introduced later.





Phoneme

A sound that can be made by one or more letters, eg s, k, z, oo, ph, igh.

Blending

Children need to be able to hear the separate sounds in a word and then blend them together to say the whole word. This is essential for reading.





Segmenting

Children need to be able to **hear** a whole word and **Say** every sound that they **hear**. This is essential for early spelling.

```
bed = /b/ /e/ /d/
tin= /t/ /i/ /n/
mug= /m/ /u/ /g/
```





Digraph

This means that the phoneme comprises of two letters,

e.g. II, ff, ck, ss, ea, ai





The split digraph

Some vowel digraphs are separated by a consonant. We call these split digraphs.

tie



toe

tone



cue

Trigraphs

This means that the phoneme comprises of three letters, e.g. igh, ear, ure





Tricky Words

There are many words that **cannot** be blended or segmented because they are irregular.


Colour coding Monster Phonics:

- More memorable and fun














